Secondary Assistance Scheme Applications 2nd February - 2nd April 2026

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

\$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or the school.

\$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7 – 12.

Eligibility Criteria

- Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:
- Services Australia (Centrelink) Pensioner Concession Card.
- Services Australia (Centrelink) Health Care Card; or
- Department of Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue card only, TPI and gold cards cannot be accepted as they are issued for medical benefit purposes only).

PLEASE NOTE: The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued each year and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

Parent or guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink. In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age i.e. students born in 2007 or before are ineligible in 2026.

Parents/guardians must apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme each school year in Term 1. Applications do not carry forward to future years.

The concession card must be valid at the time of SAS application (cannot use an expired concession card to apply for SAS).
